Due to circumstances beyond our control it was not possible to organise horse riding for this academic year. In consultation with the Occupational Therapist it was decided students would benefit equally from rock climbing sessions.

Due to the reduced costs it was also possible to have 2 one-mile long running tracks positioned around the grounds in school and college, which all students are able to access now works are complete.

Progress

Students began weekly rock climbing sessions at the North West Face Climbing Centre in Warrington in April 2018. Students are supported in small groups, with one qualified instructor per 3 students.

It is clear from staff feedback that students have enjoyed the challenge of rock climbing and are developing their skills and confidence quickly. On the first session one student was unable to support himself and place both feet on the climbing wall. By week 4 of the sessions he reached the top of the wall and continues to develop his strength and coordination.

100% of students in KS2 accessed the rock climbing activity. With 93% of students taking part on a weekly basis.
