

Green revolution & BBC Countryfile

Post 16 Provision at Wargrave House School and college, autism specialists, are supporting the Governments GREEN REVOLUTION along with BBC Countryfile who have launched a tree-planting project in bid to tackle climate change.

Students and staff at Wargrave House Post 16 Provision have developed their curriculum over the Covid 19 period that is creative, aspirational and supportive of the newly released Government Green Revolution and the Countryfile project. We are proud to work alongside our partners such as , Enovert, Mercure, Galliford Try, WiHa, Earlestown Cricket Club, Mersey Forest Rangers and many more who have identified exciting community projects, and supplied us with necessary resources, that the students can work on to further develop skills, gain experience and ultimately become employable.

So which point of the 10 point Government plan are we reinforcing?

Nature: Protecting and restoring the natural environment, planting 30,000 hectares of trees every year, creating and retaining thousands of jobs.

How are we supporting the BBC Countryfile project?

Project to plant 750,000 trees has been unveiled by BBC's Countryfile programme. The two-year initiative, called Plant Britain will aim to improve mental health, wellbeing and the environment.

Wargrave House Post 16 staff and students are proud to be part of these two fabulous initiatives which aim to 'Build Back Better'.

We have the following projects underway that will support, develop and underpin these projects within the local community:-

- Bird feeding recording station
- Brickwork repairs and removing some graffiti from local heritage sites
- Conservation
- Tree Planting/Forestry Skills
- Ecological Surveys

Julliet Doherty, Head of Post 16 learning said 'it is very important that the students are environmentally aware and prepared socially and employability wise to work in line with current Government opportunities and initiatives. It is so rewarding to hear the feedback from our partners and to see the progress and impact on our students that being involved in such exciting and socially responsible projects embeds'.

Scott Lancaster Enovert Community Trust Ranger said 'The Wargrave Post 16 Students endeavours are always 100% committed to the job in hand and it's not always about the outcome but the process sometimes that underpins their work. It is a pleasure working with them and their staff'.

These development projects provide the much needed step up into work for our students by equipping them with the skills, knowledge and ability that empower them to gain full time employment/supported internships.
