	Safeguarding is <b>protecting</b> people from <b>abuse</b> and <b>neglect</b> .
	Safeguarding is making sure that people are supported to have <b>full</b> and <b>happy lives</b> .

Wargrave House	Abuse
	There are different types of <b>abuse</b> .
	Abuse is when someone <b>hurts</b> you or does something that <b>upsets</b> or <b>frightens</b> you.
	Abuse is always <b>wrong</b> !

Wargrave House	Abuse can happen in different ways— types of abuse
	Physical abuse is when someone hurts your body.
	For example: • Biting • Hitting • Kicking • Hair pulling • Burning you.
	<b>Neglect</b> is when someone who is there to help you <b>does not</b> <b>look after you</b> properly.
	<ul> <li>For example:</li> <li>Not feeding you</li> <li>Not keeping you safe</li> <li>Not keeping you clean</li> <li>Not giving you medicine you need.</li> </ul>

Wargrave House	Types of abuse continued
*#i@ii?*I	<b>Emotional abuse</b> is when someone <b>talks</b> to you in <b>unkind</b> ways.
	<ul> <li>For example:</li> <li>bullying or teasing you</li> <li>swearing at you</li> <li>ignoring you</li> <li>threatening you</li> <li>saying bad things to you.</li> </ul>
	Financial abuse is when someone takes your money or things that belong to you.
	<ul> <li>For example:</li> <li>stealing your money</li> <li>deciding how to spend your money without asking you</li> <li>making you pay for things when you do not want to.</li> </ul>

Wargrave House	Types of abuse continued
	Sexual abuse is someone touching your body or private parts without your permission.
	Sexual abuse is someone making you <b>touch them</b> in a way you <b>do not want</b> .
	<ul> <li>For example:</li> <li>Someone kissing you without asking</li> <li>Someone touching your bottom, breasts or genitals without asking</li> <li>Someone making you watch or look at sexual pictures or films</li> <li>Someone having sex with you when you do not want them to</li> <li>Someone who does not stop touching you or having sex with you when you say 'no' or 'stop'.</li> </ul>

	<b>Discrimination</b> is when someone <b>treats you badly</b> because of:
	<ul> <li>Your race and skin colour</li> </ul>

	If someone is being abused, somebody should make sure they are <b>safe.</b>
	If someone is being abused, the abuse should <b>stop</b> .
