Dear parents and carers,

Welcome to our half-termly Newsletter.



Hello everyone I trust you are all well and looking forward to the half term break. I want to begin with a thank you to parents and carers for their support at our recent parent consultation evening. It is really pleasing to see so many of you engaging with the school in such a positive manner and I believe this highlights that we are all in this together to get the best for our young people.

I am confident that parents and carers received the information about their learner that they need and that they have a good understanding of the progress being made at school. If for any reason you were not able to attend the parent meeting or talk to class staff please feel free to contact the class teacher for an update.

Despite having had two bank holidays in the last half term Wargrave House School has been a hive of activity as you will see in the rest of this newsletter. The whole range of experiences we can offer our students has continued with visits to the coast and country parks to name a few. These activities not only help our learners develop social skills but also help build their confidence in dealing with new surroundings or settings. Another activity worth mentioning has been the raising of money for local charities (mentioned in last week's bulletin) which shows both community awareness and citizenship. We are very proud of the students who took part.

Our focus on teaching and learning has continued and recently we have been looking at Science in the school. We have seen some excellent practice and some great experiences for our learners but we have also identified some areas that can be improved or developed further and these will be a focus for our planning for the New Year.

There are so many encouraging aspects to life at Wargrave but you don't just take need to take our word for it as we have undergone a number of external audits and/or inspections by Local Authorities and an inspector from NASS (National Association of Independent Schools and Non-Maintained Special Schools) and all have reported positively on the school. From a safeguarding audit by St Helens, and the visit from NASS through to an in depth provision audit by Halton LA, all have praised the quality of the provision in the school.

For example when looking at student voice and engagement the NASS representative commented that what he saw was "one of, if not the best practice I have seen in all the schools I have visited". Comments from Halton LA representatives in their inspection included "a skilled team of people who know their roles and are committed to giving the best for their children". It is pleasing to hear such positive comments from professional colleagues and I hope it reassures you as parents as to how we here at Wargrave House look after our children and help them develop as individuals.

Finally, as a result of all the excellent work and by having fantastic students we have been awarded Beacon Status as a school, a very prestigious nationally recognised award. I thought I would take this opportunity to say a massive well done and thank you to all the staff and students in the school on all these accolades.

Few would be surprised to hear I continue to enjoy my time at Wargrave House, I suppose the people and the place kind of 'get under your skin' so to speak and it is a privilege to work with you all.

I hope all students and parents have a relaxing and enjoyable half term break and look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 5th of June.

An Important Reminder About Medication

Any medication sent in to school needs to be in the original packaging with a completed parental consent form.

OUR TOP TIPS FOR KEEPING YOUR LEARNER SAFE



We know children love spending time outdoors, whether in the garden, park or beach, however, their skin is more delicate than an adult's and can easily be damaged by the sun, even when it doesn't seem strong.





Use a sunscreen with a minimum SPF 50 and at least 4 stars for UVA protection.



Wear sunglasses, ideally with wrap around lenses or wide arms, which carry CE and British Standard marks.



Reapply every two hours or immediately after swimming or sweating.



No sunscreen offers 100% protection so cover up with loose close weave clothing (such as cotton) and a wide brimmed hat to protect the neck, ears and face.



Generously apply sunscreen (5 teaspoons to cover the whole body) 15 to 20 minutes before going out.

Seek shade between 11am - 3pm when the sun is at its strongest. Always keep babies and toddlers in the shade if you can.





By following these simple tips your child will be able to stay safe and enjoy the sun. Remember parents, set your child a good example by also following this advice, and the whole family can have a happy sun safe summer.








RISE 2



Excellent work BASE 2!
















In our maths number lessons this half term, the focus has been division and sharing. We have shown this in lots of different ways which is important as everyone learns in different ways. We have all worked very hard.














